Robert Andrews Biography

Master Police Officer Robert Andrews is a 17-year veteran with the Orlando Police Department. He is currently assigned to Orlando International Airport training unit and TAC unit. In this position, he provides training for officers assigned to the airport in firearms, and response to an active shooter/assailant. He is a firearms and active shooter instructor. His secondary duties include dignitary protection for VIP's during their travels through Orlando, FL.

Robert has been on the department's SWAT team for over 12 years and is one of the team's snipers.

Before joining the Orlando Police Department, Robert was a police officer in the island of St. Croix U.S. Virgin Islands (VIPD) for three years. Prior to his employment at VIPD, he was an M1A1 Abrams Tank Commander in the United States Marine Corps.

Robert was at both the downtown Orlando active shooter incident in November 2009 and the Pulse Nightclub incident a little over two months ago.

Terry Sanford Biography

Master Police Officer Terry Sanford is a 16-year veteran with the Orlando Police Department. He is currently assigned to the training unit. In this position, he provides training to the department in defensive tactics, firearms, law enforcement vehicle operations and responding to an active shooter.

Terry has been on the department's SWAT team for over 13 years and is one of the team's snipers.

Before joining the Orlando Police Department, Terry was a Special Forces (Green Beret) soldier in the US Army. Terry retired in 2004 when he returned from Afghanistan with more than 20 years of service.
